

POLICY ON REPRINTS, REPRODUCTIONS, AND FEES

ABOUT US:

The Thoreau Society Collections at the Thoreau Institute at Walden Woods offer access to a large number of images and documents relating to Henry David Thoreau, Concord, and New England Transcendentalism, as well materials relating to the archeological work of Roland Robbins. The Society's holdings include the following:

On-site access to the collections is by appointment only. You can contact the Henley library at the Thoreau Institute to schedule an appointment at 781-259-4730. Established in 1941, The Thoreau Society is the oldest and largest organization devoted to an American author. The Society has long contributed to the dissemination of knowledge about Thoreau by collecting books, manuscripts, and artifacts relating to Thoreau and his contemporaries, by encouraging the use of its collections, and by publishing articles in two Society periodicals.

In establishing its collections in 1998 at the Thoreau Institute, the Society sought to make the materials in its care better known and more widely available by allowing and encouraging the reprinting and reproduction of items in the collections. In order to make a real contribution to defraying the costs of their maintenance and good stewardship, the Society charges reasonable market rates for reprints and reproductions.

POLICY AND FEES

All permissions are for “a single language, one-time, non-exclusive use in one publication/medium and one edition/product”; for other and/or later uses (e.g., reprintings or new editions or translations), applicants have to reapply. When published, the applicant agrees to supply the Thoreau Society with two copies of the reproduced or reprinted material as it appears in print/on the web. Material published must be acknowledged as “Reprinted/Reproduced by permission of The Thoreau Society, Inc.” Illustrations must also be accompanied by the legend: “[Name of specific collection], The Thoreau Society Collections at the Thoreau Institute at Walden Woods, Lincoln MA.”

FEES

Checks should be made out to The Thoreau Society, Inc. We also accept the following credit cards: Visa, Master Card, Discover, and American Express.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

- A non-refundable processing fee of \$20.00 must accompany each application.
- If the application is approved, the Thoreau Society will inform the applicant of the total fee for the use planned in the application. Payment in advance is required.
- Reproduction Fees for Photographs and Illustrations:
 - Photographs and illustrations reproduced as quarter-page illustrations: \$75.00
 - Photographs and illustrations reproduced as half-page illustrations: \$150.00
 - Photographs and illustrations reproduced as three-quarter-page illustrations: \$225.00
 - Photographs and illustrations reproduced as full-page illustrations: \$300.00
 - Photographs and illustrations reproduced on book covers/dust jackets: \$375.00
- Reproduction Fees for Written Documents
 - Short manuscripts or typescripts [under ten pages]: \$150.00
 - Longer manuscripts or typescripts [over ten pages]: \$150.00 plus \$5.00 per page for each page above ten pages.
 - Reprinting Fees for Thoreau Society Publications: 10 cents per word.
- Other Fees
 - An additional service fee will be charged by the Thoreau Institute for reprinting/reproducing Thoreau Society materials housed in its library; this amount will be included in the total fee sent to applicants by the Thoreau Society (see above).
 - An “express service” fee for response in less than two weeks of \$50.00 will be charged.
 - A fee of \$30.00 will be charged for providing a CD containing illustrations.
- Waiver of Fees for Graduate Students
 - All fees and charges will be waived for graduate students currently enrolled full time for an M.A. or Ph.D. degree. Proof of enrollment must accompany the application.

THE THOREAU SOCIETY COLLECTIONS POLICY

Please ensure the following:

(a) inclusion of the clearly visible credit line “Courtesy [Name of specific collection], The Thoreau Society Collections at the Thoreau Institute at Walden Woods, Lincoln MA.” adjacent to the item; and (b) payment of applicable fees for one-time-use reproduction.

Additionally, permission for the specific use requested is granted upon payment of the reproduction fee(s) (checks to be made out to The Thoreau Society, Inc.). Additional use of the item(s) in any other product or form other than that specified here (for instance, in a separate digital version of a printed book) requires another written request and the payment of an additional reproduction fee.

Display in museum and similar exhibitions usually does not involve payment of reproduction fees (unless an image is to be included in a printed catalogue), nor does use in a student presentation, in most teaching situations (provided that the Thoreau Society Collections material is provided to students free of charge), or in dissertations (unless the dissertation is to be reproduced by a distribution agency). Such uses nevertheless require the written permission of the Thoreau Society and the inclusion of the credit line or verbal acknowledgment, as appropriate. However, all Web uses of Thoreau Society images—even for educational purposes—require payment of the reproduction fee.

We do not grant exclusive rights to any party for use of specific images.
